- Act as the division's educational leader, working with the school's Academic Coordinator Team, Student Support Team, and faculty to ensure the use of researchinformed pedagogy and curriculum in support of our students' academic, social, emotional, spiritual, and physical growth
- Support AOS faculty through the use of evaluation, growth goals, and a consistent dedication to various forms of professional development
- Partner with the Director of Finance and Operations to critically examine and maintain the lower school division budget
- Function as the chief articulator of the division's programs, expectations, and vision while being visibly present throughout the school and its various gatherings
- Work closely with the Head of School to conduct hiring, retention, and assignment of faculty
