Overview

La Scuola is the first International Baccalaureate-PYP and MYP-authorized, Reggio Emilia inspired, Italian Immersion in the world! Founded in San Francisco in 2002 as La Piccola Scuola Italiana, La Scuola has grown from a small playgroup of Italian-American and Italian families to a thriving international and multicultural community of over 300 families/410 students from preschool through Grade 8.

The three campuses are joyful places where the learning is palpable and community vibrant. It is clear that the school culture revolves around relationships. The families come from a wide range of backgrounds from around the world and speak more than 34 different languages, and the breadth of that global community is the foundation of the school experience. With their willingness to seek multiple perspectives and see the world through a global lens, La Scuola students see beyond the boundaries of right and wrong to understand nuance, appreciate empathy, and lead towards a more open, connected world. The school offers best-in-class curricula that leverage all that is known globally about teaching, learning, and child development, including International Baccalaureate, Reggio Emilia, Singapore Math, Columbia Writer's Workshop, and the Pollyanna Racial Literacy Curriculum. Students are seen as individuals capable of asking challenging questions and doing and communicating their abilities and interests in extraordinary ways.

The faculty and staff are the heart of La Scuola, creating thoughtful and inspiring learning experiences for students every day. La Scuola attracts talented individuals from around the globe who are drawn to the unique blend of International Baccalaureate, Reggio Emilia, and Language Immersion philosophies and a warm and joyous environment. Together nearly half of their team (48%) holds advanced degrees in their area of specialization, and each contributes a distinct perspective to the student, family and collegial experience. Representing over 14 countries including Italy, Peru, Puerto Rico, Mexico, Syria, India, Brazil, Ghana, Albania, Chile, Brazil, Turkmenistan, and El Salvador, 45% of the staff is of international origin with over 17 languages spoken.



Opportunities and Challenges

As an International Baccalaureate Italian Immersion School, our diverse community helps our students think beyond their immediate environment and engage with the many different people of our increasingly globalized world. La Scuola commits to being innovative and open to the changes in education that will allow students to thrive in the 21st century. In addition, thanks to the close interaction with peers and teachers from all over the world, students are developing strong crosscultural awareness and learn more than one language. The school is seeking a diversity, equity, inclusion and belonging practitioner and leader who will support the school community to continue to grow in this area and who will build on the strong local community connections that are already in place and be charged with developing new connections locally and globally.

The Director of Community Engagement serves on the school's Leadership Team, reports to the Head of School and the COO and is responsible for advancing the school's DEIB goals and mission internally and outward facing. The individual will focus on ensuring DEIB practices are held to the highest standards in teaching and learning and will develop programs and partnerships aligned with the school's mission and values. The Director will be a link and liaison between La Scuola and our greater local community, fostering and strengthening connections with the Mission neighborhood, the city, and beyond

Specifically, we are expecting this new leader to:

- Support a safe learning environment for all and attend to the emotional and developmental needs of each student;
- Further develop the intercultural sensitivity and humility of the school's faculty and staff;
- Continue to grow the school's sense of community by fostering open mindedness and mutual respect;
- Support teachers to have difficult conversations around DEIB topics with parents and students;
- Develop and promote DEIB and practices in support of ALL students at La Scuola;
- Create and maintain grade and Division level partnerships that enhance curriculum to support student learning across preschool – grade 8;



- Look for ways to open campus to the greater community and connect our teachers students and families with local facilities and programs;
- Run parent education series on DEIB topics for families preK-8.

- An orientation to think, and act at both the strategic and operational levels and the ability to manage details and the larger picture;
