

Overview

One of the finest and most innovative schools in the Midwest, Visitation is an Independent Catholic school founded in 1873 by the Sisters of the Visitation. The school provides an excellent education for its 570 students in a Catholic environment permeated with Salesian Spirituality and the living tradition of the Visitation Sisters. The school educates boys and girls from Montessori Pre-K through grade five, and is all girls in grades six through twelve, providing the only all-girls Middle and High School experience in the state of Minnesota, with all the documented advantages of the single-gender setting.

Programming in academics, athletics, and the arts is stellar; the faculty is first rate; and students are accepted to outstanding colleges and universities throughout the US, including those that are most selective.

Guided by the timeless and profound spirituality of St. Francis de Sales who preached the "Little Virtues," including kindness, courage, humility, acceptance and Liberty of Spirit, Visitation embraces a philosophy of education that encompasses but also goes well beyond high academic achievement, emphasizing growth and wholeness of mind, body, and spirit, in keeping with its motto: "We learn not for school, but for life." The school's cherished Salesian charism touches the hearts and minds of all who teach and learn there, creating an atmosphere of mutual care, warmth, and camaraderie that envelops everyone.

Visitation is situated on a beautiful 66-acre campus in Mendota Heights, MN, a handsome and historic suburb which combines small town charm with easy access to all that the Twin Cities have to offer, with their robust economy, flourishing arts, cultural, and culinary scenes, and professional sports.

The school launched the 2023 school year with a joyous, community-wide celebration of its 150th Anniversary. Now that the first 150 years are triumphantly in the books, Visitation is eager to find a dynamic, relational, and faith-filled new Head with a track record of successful school leadership, to help take this venerable and beloved school to the next level.



Opportunities and Challenges

- To help ensure that the living legacy of the Sisters of The Visitation remains the heart and soul of the school, expand and strengthen the Salesian Center as a resource for studies and worship in Salesian Spirituality at the school and in the larger community;
- Deepen the school's commitment to academic excellence by enhancing the curriculum and supporting
 the faculty as they pursue innovative, student-centered instructional and curricular practices that
 keep Visitation at the forefront of educational best practices;
- As Visitation plans to launch a major capital campaign in the next two years, the next Head will be
 expected to contribute energetic leadership for this exciting and transformative effort, helping to
 shape campaign strategy, build connections with the donor community, and assist with the securing
 of support to enhance the endowment and accomplish much-needed capital projects;
- Claim, leverage, and expand the school's expertise in educating young women prepared to lead in a global world, and take greater advantage of Visitation's unique status as the state's only all-girls middle and high school in marketing and admissions efforts;
- Focus on enhancing enrollment by strengthening awareness in the broader community of all that
 Visitation School has to offer. Along with its distinguished academics and inspiring spirituality, it
 provides a warm and inclusive environment where students find powerful affirmation and many
 different pathways to success, fulfilling the teachings of St.Francis de Sales: "Be who you are, and
 be that well."





Qualifications and Personal Attributes

The most qualified candidates will hold a Master's degree in a relevant field, draw on strong executive leadership skills to lead an institution in an ever-changing world, and will be earnestly committed to the school's mission and values.

- A person of Catholic faith who has a history of leading with Salesian values -- qualities that include honesty, acceptance, generosity, humility, gentle strength, kindness, patience, simplicity, liberty of spirit, interiority, joyful optimism, courage, acceptance and stewardship;

- Deep understanding of the challenges and opportunities associated with a K12 independent school community, and particularly cognizant of the unique challenges that Catholic schools face today;
- Strong understanding of, and commitment to, the benefits of a single-gender education;
- Exemplary oral and written communication skills, specifically when articulating vision and strategy, as well as towards fundraising efforts;
- A student of leadership, with experience nurturing and developing the confidence to delegate effectively to a strong leadership team;
- Understanding of (or willingness to learn about) the educational landscape of the Twin Cities and the capacity to clearly articulate the legacy of, and vision for, Visitation;
- Proven ability to assemble strong leadership teams and draw a community together in support of institutional goals;
- Capable of attracting, retaining, and growing teachers, academic leaders, coaches and staff in order to sustain and enhance the school's commitment to academic and extracurricular excellence;
- Embrace and cultivate diversity, social justice, and inclusion, particularly as the student body grows;
- A confident leader capable of calmly handling divergent views and demands of parents, donors, and alumnae, and able to communicate clearly and resolutely, staying true to the Salesian values and strategic vision of the school.
