Overview

Deerfield Academy is an independent, co-educational, boarding and day school serving approximately 650 students in grade nine through postgraduate. Committed to the highest standards of scholarship, citizenship, and personal responsibility, Deerfield offers a rigorous liberal arts curriculum, an expansive cocurricular program, and a supportive residential environment. Founded in 1797 by a charter signed by then-Governor Samuel Adams, Deerfield opened its doors to students in 1799 with a mission to promote "Piety, Religion, & Morality... in the liberal Arts and Sciences." More than two centuries later, the Academy remains deeply rooted in tradition while preparing students for the demands of the modern world. Emblematic of this enduring spirit is Deerfield's unique mascot—the Door—which represents openness to learning and the transition from youth to adulthood. Distinctive and deeply meaningful, the Door has become a cherished emblem for students and alumni alike, marking the threshold of growth and transformation that defines the Deerfield experience.

As true to its liberal arts foundation, Deerfield's Athletics program plays a central role in shaping a student's journey, fostering resilience, teamwork, and school spirit, while reinforcing the school's commitment to balance between mind, body, and character. 
