As both a visionary and hands-on leader, the Director will strengthen TAS's reputation as one of the world's top international college preparatory schools by leading a highly effective team, building influential relationships with universities worldwide, and fostering a program that empowers students to become confident, informed, and globally competitive applicants. The Director will also serve as an integral member of the Upper School Leadership Team, contributing to broader conversations on curriculum, student well-being, and holistic development.
