LIVING IN VALENCIA

American School of Valencia is located in Puçol, 20 kilometers (12 miles) north from Valencia. Learn more about this beautiful city, where a wide range of cultural and social activities are offered to both locals and internationals. Valencia, Spain's third-largest city, sits on the Mediterranean coast, boasting a rich history spanning over 2,000 years. Its location provides a pleasant climate with over 300 sunny days annually and mild temperatures. The city's geography includes diverse natural landscapes such as the fertile Horta region, the Turia River, the Albufera lake, and La Devesa del Saler forest.

The historical significance is evident in its well-preserved Roman and Medieval structures, with the historic center, Ciutat Vella, showcasing over 30 monuments, including the UNESCO World Heritage site La Lonja de la Seda or The Silk Exchange. The Fallas festival, also a UNESCO recognized event, is an unparalleled experience for international visitors, who will be amazed by the dimensions and the color of the Fallas monuments, as well as for all the cultural and festive calendar organized around its plantá and cremá in the third week of March.

Among its different neighborhoods, the historic Ciutat Vella invites exploration of its narrow streets and picturesque squares. The Turia Garden, with its 18 bridges, provides a green space for leisure and sport. Coastal areas like Cabañal and Malvarrosa are known for their beaches, the cuisine scene, and its unique character. Valencia pulsates with life, offering a blend of Mediterranean atmosphere and a wealth of cultural attractions.

Since 2007, when Valencia hosted the America's Cup, our city has captured the attention of a growing number of international visitors. In recent years, a significant portion of them are not only drawn by its charm but are considering Valencia as a place to settle down and enjoy a truly enhanced quality of life. This growing appeal is widely recognized by international media and organizations.

The basic mission of the Head of School is to:

- Assumes professional responsibility.
- Promotes a climate of collaboration, cooperation, and respect.
- Represents the School pedagogically before third parties.
- Represents the interests and ideas of all academic levels before the Board. Presents and reports to the Board of Governors.



- Implements Board instructions with reference to agreements, directly or through the Board's delegated committees.
- Reports to the Board and the General Meeting of Shareholders on the execution of the plans entrusted to them.
- Ensures communication within the School Community.
- Represents teaching and non-teaching staff in their relations with families.
- Coordinates accreditation processes.
- Safeguards the School's image.
- Ensures implementation of the School's mission.
- Receives and resolves concerns from the School Community.
- Develops educational proposals.
- Certifies academic documentation.

Strategic

- Oversees institutional objectives.
- Develops policies in collaboration with the Board of Governors.
- Ensures alignment of educational programs with the School's mission and strategic goals.
- Leads the strategic planning process.
- Proposes modifications to internal regulations and handbooks.
- Ensures institutional consistency across programs and practices.
- Designs and promotes new educational programs.
- Supports student recruitment and retention strategies.



Academic and Educational

- Leads and oversees the School's educational program.
- Ensures compliance with academic quality standards.
- Manages student discipline in accordance with School policies.
- Oversees extracurricular and enrichment programs.
- Supervises academic performance and results.


