



OVERVIEW

Frankfurt International School (FIS) is a non-profit international school, providing students aged 3 to Grade 12 a world-class education across two campuses – FISW (age 3 to Grade 8) in Wiesbaden, and FISO (age 3 to Grade 12) in Oberursel. Current student enrollment is approximately 1,820 (1,600 at Oberursel and 220 in Wiesbaden). Founded in 1961, the school's teaching and learning practices are rooted in the International Baccalaureate (IB) with a strong emphasis on academic rigor and preparation for university studies. While academic success is at the center of school life, the arts, sciences, humanities, language learning, life skills and athletics provide the foundation for their learning community.

FIS is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). It is also a founding member of the *International Baccalaureate Organization* (IBO) and has been offering the IB Diploma Programme for over 50 years, as well as an American High School Diploma. The school is a founding member of the European Council of International Schools (ECIS), which was renamed The Educational Collaborative for International Schools in 2016 and is also a member of the Association for German International Schools (AGIS).

Frankfurt International School (FIS), an extraordinary school in Europe with global recognition, now seeks an exceptional, vision-forward and operationally strong Principal to lead the Wiesbaden Campus, serving approximately 220 students from Age 3 through Grade 8, beginning in August 2026.

This is a rare opportunity to lead a close-knit, family-oriented campus with outstanding resources, a strong culture of trust, and the flexibility to innovate as part of a large, high-performing IB World School. The Principal will advance FIS's *Designed to Thrive* ethos by fostering a campus where learning, wellbeing, and belonging are intentionally designed and sustained.



POSITION OVERVIEW

The Principal is the instructional leader and administrative head of the FIS Wiesbaden Campus and a key member of the FIS Senior Leadership Team. As the leader of a small satellite campus, the role requires both instructional leadership and operational oversight, along with close collaboration with central leadership to ensure alignment, sustainability, and coherence across the school.

The Principal will build upon a learning culture that is intentionally designed for student growth, agency, well-being, and inclusion, with particular attention to strong learning support practices and the needs of diverse learners. Leveraging the inquiry-driven Primary Years Programme (PYP), the role promotes purposeful, developmentally responsive learning experiences that balance academic rigor with creativity and care. Within a campus structure that supports innovative, student-centered approaches (including outdoor education, schedules designed for depth of instruction, and learning grounded in clear progressions) the successful candidate will translate vision into meaningful and sustainable outcomes through strong partnerships with families, staff, and the broader school community.



KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Developing the individual vision, culture, and strategy on the FISW campus while maintaining alignment and connection with the larger FISO campus
- Overseeing teaching and learning, including leading a teacher leadership team, managing professional development, working closely with curriculum leaders to map out change, and managing initiatives related to changes in our language instruction models
- Providing operational oversight in partnership with the schoolwide Finance & Operations department
- Working closely with parents and the community to ensure FISW remains family-oriented and collaborative with the local community
- Various additional expectations relevant to a principal role
